It's really unfortunate, and I do blame media partially. Adam Strand isn't depressed, he's just bored. Like I said, the concept is interesting and the book has some nice moments, but it doesn't explain much about why he kills himself or why he survives and the resolutions come too fast and seem contrived. What really happens when we die? The book was split into many tiny chapters with clever names that often repeated background information--sometimes it felt as though this novel had been published piecemeal and was pushed together into a novel. The fact that the concept reincarnation after suicide is so utterly bonkers, makes it more interesting.
